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Pride in Place Programme: PiP Monitoring Return April 2026

1. Background

- 1.1. The first submission for Phase 1 PiP monitoring returns must be returned by 30 April 2026. A mid year return will be requested in October 2026.
- 1.2. Pride in Place Programme reporting must be completed online using an MHCLG digital tool. It is the responsibility of Local Authorities, in their current role as the Accountable body, to complete the monitoring return.
- 1.3. The monitoring process is designed by MHCLG to be light touch. Details on Capacity Funding spend and plans are included. In terms of project delivery, the April form requests information on Board approved projects that will spend funding in the first 6 months. A forecast of spend for the first 12 months is requested at intervention level. Details on Board membership changes are also required. The outputs section relates to achieved outputs and as projects have not yet commenced these cannot yet be recorded.
- 1.4. Once submitted, returns are final. On submitting the form, we must confirm that the S151 Officer is content and has been able to conduct their responsibilities as the accountable body.
- 1.5. All information submitted as part of the monitoring return must be signed off by the Neighbourhood Board and be made publicly available following submission to MHCLG.
- 1.6. Details of the monitoring process have been provided in the PiP Local Assurance Framework.

1. Board to review and agree the PiP Monitoring Return for April 2026 for submission by the Borough Council by the deadline of 30 April 2026.
